

Closure Crisis — Texas is Ground Zero








Texas rural hospitals **CLOSED** since 2010 (double any other state)

- 3 in 2018 (Stamford, Rockdale, Cameron)
- 3 in 2017 (Crockett, Trinity, Weimar)




Impact of Closure

Forecast – 88th

- Revenue Forecast \$29b surplus
- PHE through 10/13/22
- LAR \$16m + 89m + \$123m bumps for targeted Medicaid rate enhancement (rural) in base budget
- More reporting (SB809 &1137)
- Healthcare as lower priority

- Days Cash on Hand
- Designation (CAH or PPS)
- Government Support (Tax Rev)
- Hospital Size (Beds)
- Accumulated Depreciation (Reinvestment)
- Diversification (Departments/Services)
- Desirability (Population Change)
- Financial Performance (Net Income)
- Geography/Location (> 50 miles)
- 2020 Disruption (Rev Change)
